About Pride in Place



Pride in Place is a big piece of work the Government is working on.



It gives money to make local areas better for the people who live there.



This will help people to feel proud of where they live.



The Government is giving Manchester nearly 1 hundred million pounds.



The money will help to make parts of Manchester better over the next 10 years.

What are Neighbourhood Boards



As part of Pride in Place, we are setting up some groups called **Neighbourhood Boards**.



These are groups of people who work together to make their local area better.



Neighbourhood Boards are made up of local people and organisations.



Together they help to make changes that people in the area want and need.

We are setting up Neighbourhood Boards in these 5 areas:



Clayton Vale

This also means parts of Clayton and Openshaw, Miles Platting and Newton Heath.



Gorton South

This also means parts of Longsight, Gorton and Abbey Hey, and Levenshulme.



Benchill South and Wythenshawe Central



Harpurhey South and Monsall

This also means parts of Harpurhey, Moston, and Crumpsall.



Moss Side West

This means parts of Whalley Range and Moss Side.



Each area will get 20 million pounds.



The Boards will help to decide how best to spend this money.

Being on the board



We are looking for people to join our Neighbourhood Boards.



To be on the board, you must care about your local area and the people living there.



You must be able to come to meetings and make decisions for where you live.



You must be able to share your ideas and what you know about the area.



And you must come to any training you need to be on the board.



Being part of the board is voluntary. This means you will not get paid any money.



But we will pay for things like travel to get to the meetings.



You don't need any special skills to be on 1 of our boards. And you don't need to have been on a board before.

How to take part



If you want to be on 1 of our boards, you can email us. Your email can be up to 500 words long.

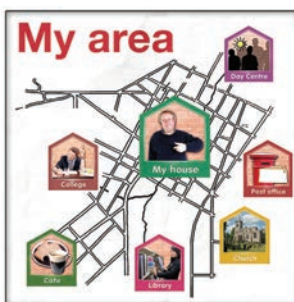


Or you can send us a short video. Your video can be 3 to 5 minutes long.
